Dear Parents, Campers and Church Camp Contacts,

As of now, we are making plans to have regular camps this summer. We are working on COVID health precautions. In addition to spiritual development, our regular camps (except Day Camp) will also include Basketball, Volleyball, Canoeing, Archery, and many other fun and educational activities.

Enclosed you will find camp registration forms and camp rules. We need each form <u>completely</u> filled in for each camper. We ask each camper and parent to <u>read and consent to the camp rules</u>. <u>We are setting a deadline</u> <u>of June 23 to receive camp registrations in our association office</u>, so that the Camp Directors will know how many to plan for and to insure adequate space and supplies. Every camper that registers by the deadline will receive an attractive T-shirt.

Camp fees are listed by each camp. We will have a free snack stand again this year, so there is no need to send snacks or money with campers. We are including a small additional camper fee with the registration fee to cover the cost of snacks and missions giving. We will provide some partial scholarships upon request for those who need it. Camp fees should be sent with registration forms. Forms and fees should be returned to the sponsoring church (the Franklin Baptist Association Church you attend or nearest your home) by June 19. Each church then should turn in all completed forms and fees to the Association Office by June 23. If possible, it would help for the sponsoring church to collect all registration forms and fees and submit all of them at one time to the Association Office. It is also helpful to us if the church will send one check to cover all fees for all campers. Churches are encouraged to make and keep copies of registration forms before submitting originals to FBA office.

Upon recommendation of the Health Department, at check-in time each camper will be discreetly checked for possible head lice and temperature. In the unlikely case that anyone is found with head lice or temperature, they will be sent home, and will have to be treated before they are permitted to return to camp. We regret any inconvenience or embarrassment this may cause, but are sure you will appreciate this safeguard.

# DO NOT FORGET all camp registrations MUST BE submitted on or before June 23 into the FBA office.

We <u>may</u> not be able to receive registrations after that date, depending on limited space and resources. Please be sure to stress the registration deadline when you promote camp. In the unlikely case our camp reaches capacity, we will register campers by the date we receive their forms. Prospective campers will be notified by telephone <u>if</u> they can <u>NOT</u> be accommodated. Please, <u>help get the registration forms into your local sponsoring church</u> as soon as possible, and no later than June 19, so all forms can be brought to the Association Office by June 23.

Feel free to duplicate camp forms, rules and letters for each camper (please use white paper for registration forms and copy back pages also), or call our office at 636-583-2639, if you need an additional quantity.

\*NOTE: Please do not arrive before the posted arrival times, as our staff will not be in place to give proper supervision and processing. Also, we ask only one parent or guardian accompany each child at checkin to minimize possible COVID-19 exposures. Camp Location: 6109 Highway AC, Leslie, MO 63056

#### THINGS TO BRING TO CAMP

Bring Bible, four or five changes of clothing, towels and washcloths, soap, toothbrush & toothpaste, hairbrush & comb, bug spray, sunscreen, swimsuit, a cover-up to wear over swimsuit, sheets, blanket or sleeping bag and pillow. An old pair of tennis shoes may be useful. If you play a musical instrument, you may bring it if you want to play or use it for special music. If there is any other special equipment needed or other important program information (such as shooting permission, etc.), a camp preparation letter will be sent to campers after their registration forms are received. Please Mark ALL items with campers name. THINGS YOU DO NOT BRING; Hand held computer games, cell phones, radios, CD or MP3 players, fireworks, coolers or food.

#### **DRESS AT CAMP**

Attire should be modest and appropriate for a Christian atmosphere. Short shorts or short skirts or dresses, bikinis or any clothing exposing the midriff area are inappropriate. Two piece swim wear must be covered by a shirt or blouse.

# GENERAL RULES FOR CHILDREN AND YOUTH CAMPS SPRING BLUFF RETREAT CENTER FRANKLIN BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

- 1. All persons participating in camp activities shall conduct themselves in a Christian manner.
- 2. **No camper will be allowed to leave camp** until checkout time on the last day, except for emergencies or illness, and then only after notifying Camp Director. Staff are to notify Camp Director if they need to leave the camp for any reason.
- 3. *Visitation by family or friends is not allowed* at the camp during organized camp because it can disrupt the camping experience for campers and possible health risks. Exceptions are permitted <u>only</u> by permission from the Camp Director. **Pastors are always welcome.**
- 4. There is no mail service at the Retreat Center.
- 5. Camper medications are to be turned into the camp nurse or Camp Director upon arrival.
- 6. We <u>cannot accept</u> a camper who has been <u>exposed to a contagious or infectious disease</u> (i.e. COVID, etc.) within the two weeks prior to camp, or who have symptoms of possible COVID when arriving at camp.
- 7. Smoking, intoxicating beverages, illegal drugs, profanity, and immoral acts of any kind are prohibited on the grounds and in the buildings at all times.
- 8. Firearms, fireworks, sling shots, hunting knives, rock throwing and any dangerous toys are prohibited.
- 9. Campers and leaders are responsible for keeping trash picked up off the grounds continuously. The camp will be free of trash before anyone leaves on last day of camp.
- 10. Campers are required to keep their cabins clean. Cabin inspection will be conducted each morning. Cabins must pass inspection before campers leave on the last day of camp.
- 11. Swimsuits will be worn only at the pool. Must wear t-shirt over 2 piece suits.
- 12. No one is to swim in the pool except at scheduled swim times to insure proper supervision. <u>NO</u> swimming in the lake at anytime.
- 13. Shoes are required to be worn, except in dorms or during specific planned activities.
- 14. Only school, sport or Christian slogans are permitted on T-shirts or caps.
- 15. Modest clothing must be worn at all times.
- 16. No hiking is allowed in the woods or outside campgrounds without an adult supervisor.
- 17. Campers are not to use canoes, or fish in the lake, except by permission and supervision of an adult sponsor. All fishing is "catch and release" unless permitted otherwise.
- 18. Campers must have an adult with them to be in the campfire area.
- 19. Food and drinks are not to be consumed in the dorms. Use approved areas only for food.
- 20. Refrain from abusing equipment and buildings. Campers are liable for any damage.
- 21. Campers are <u>not</u> to bring cell phones, radios, tape players, CDs, TVs or other audio-visual type equipment to camp. Staff may bring needed equipment.
- 22. Cabin switching is not allowed without Camp Director's specific approval.
- 23. Bunks and bunk mattresses are not to be moved from one cabin to another without specific permission of the Camp Caretaker/Manager and if moved must be returned to original cabin.
- 24. All campers are to remain in the cabins after night devotions until morning activities.
- 25. All campers and cabin leaders are expected to participate in all planned camp activities, unless an activity has been noted as prohibited during registration, or unless ill.
- 26. There will be no dorm raiding or tricks allowed.
- 27. If a camper becomes ill, they will be dismissed from camp and fees returned.
- 28. Campers will not be permitted to make phone calls during camp, except for emergencies. Parents or relatives may call the Camp Director at the camp, if they need to contact their child. The camp phone number is 573-457-8346.
- 29. Other rules may be imposed by Camp Director as/when needed.
